Crossing borders in type 2 inflammation

Dr. Edward Knol, Biomedical scientist and immunologist, UMC Utrecht

Edward Knol is a biomedical scientist and immunologist in the departments of Immunology and Dermatology/Allergology at the University Medical Center Utrecht, the Netherlands. He obtained his PhD training at the University of Amsterdam and had a postdoc position at Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, USA. In his career Edward Knol discovered CD63 as the basophil activation marker and described the role of peanut allergen Ara h 2. His scientific research focuses on allergic diseases, in particularly eczema and food allergy. He heads the Platform Immune Monitoring in the UMC Utrecht and holds the position of Vice President Congresses at the European Academy of Allergy and Clinical Immunology.
